President's Letter — April 2020

We did discuss other activities that could replace some of the income lost by not having a Show, including an online auction of our mini quilts and a studio tour which you will hear more about as the ideas are developed. With careful management of our funds and some creative thinking, we will be able to sustain our programs until we are again able to hold our Show.

Thank you all for your understanding and all the work that everyone has put into making this the best show yet!



Upcoming Workshop

Sunday, May 31 Workshop with Tara Faughnan Freezer Paper Piecing — Diamonds Quilt

Learn how to create freezer paper foundations for precision piecing. This technique is similar to paper piecing but foundations are reusable and there is no tearing out bits of paper afterwards! We will use the Diamonds quilt to learn the technique and achieve precise points. We will discuss how to apply it to many other patterns. In this class we will also look at the use of value and color to create visually complex quilts from the repetition of a simple block [Tara is known for her creative use of color and placement].

Use solids or prints - although the sample is in solids, it works great in prints!

This is a unique opportunity for our guild. Don't miss out!

So You Want to Quilt

Have I got a kit for you! Now that you have the time. I am cutting batting for a number of quilt tops, some are long-arm ready! The kit contains top, back, binding and batting. And I can safely deliver, or you can come way out to Laguna Seca where I live off Laureles Grade. And if you are working on a top for charity I will cut batting to the right size and you can finish it as well. Simple straight-line machine quilting is great; you don't have to get fancy. And it is good practice. If you submit a top to be made into a kit, it would be great if you also supplied backing and binding.

Also remember our Tying Event in September. Now is the time of year I usually start saving tops that would lend themselves to tying. They are usually simple designs with minimal bulky intersections. The batting we use can be tied no further apart than six inches, so plan accordingly.

A good size would be anything that would fit on our tables, where we lay them out to tie. Two six foot, or two eight foot tables, are put together to make a square. For CASA younger kids size could be 36" X 45". For the older CASA kids, and dialysis patients, we do lap quilts, which can be 41" X 60" or a little larger. And remember the guys! We are so often drawn to feminine colors and subjects.

Thank you for all you are doing to encourage others.



Block of the Month — April 2020 * Butterfly Block *



Here is an easy block to make before the next guild meeting. It's a modified block from Missouri Star Quilt Company which has a tutorial <u>here</u>.

Materials Needed

Butterfly Wings

(3) 2" x 21" strips - use three different but coordinating fabrics - bright batiks are a great choice

Background

(8) 2" x 2" squares in light to white

Butterfly Body

(1) 1" x 9.5" strip in dark

Note: use 1/4" seams

ASSEMBLY NOTES:

- 1. Sew the three strips together on the long side with a 1/4" seam. Press seams open. The width should be 5" now. Cut four 5" squares from the wide strip. (Since it was a 21" strip, there is a bit of room to straighten the ends and have a scrap.)
- 2. Lay out the four 5" squares as in the photo top two squares are horizontally and bottom two are vertically striped.
- Take the eight 2" squares and fold in half on the diagonal and press to get a diagonal crease. Place each square onto the 5" square in the positions shown. - Pay attention here. Each square is on opposite corners and different from the other 5" square.
- 4. "Sew & Flip" method: Sew on the diagonal crease and press to the corner for all eight pieces. Layout the four squares and ensure the corner pieces meet according to picture. When ensured, trim excess corner fabric. Square up if needed.
- 5. Sew top right square to bottom right, then sew the left side. Press seams open.
- 6. Sew dark body piece in the middle. Press seams to the body.
- 7. Block should measure **10**" wide x 9.5" high. Square up if needed.

Admire and make another if you enjoyed it!

PICK A COLOR - 2020 Quilt Challenge



SIZE: SUBJECT:

18" by 18" square **Pick a color for your quilt! Any Color you want!**

Use as many shades of that color, but the predominant color must be at least **80%** of the quilt. When you look at your quilt it must read the main color you have chosen, (blue, pink, yellow, purple, green, etc. . .)

It can be any style you want: art, favorite block, applique, pieced, collage, embellished.

FABRIC:Entirely your choice.DUE:August 3, 2020 at the MPQG meeting.

Your quilt must have three layers: top, batting & back, a 4" sleeve for hanging, and a label on the back to include:


