If you have NOT received your letter by MARCH 21, 2016, please contact Sharon.

Your letter will include instructions that you need to follow and a paper label that needs to be SEWN to the back of the quilt. It will also tell you that you need a sleeve or tabs on your quilt.

This quilt will be on display at the MPQG Quilts By the Bay Show on April 8, 9 and 10 at Chautauqua Hall. It is a Silent Auction Quilt to benefit the Monterey Food Bank. Opening bid is \$400. Here's the back story.

Loosen Up is composed of MPQG members Allison Barrett, Ann Houle and Jeanne Krener. In 2014, they agreed to work together on a group project that used negative space. Each had different quilt styles and they liked one anothers' work. They met once a month to brainstorm, first bringing fabrics and photos and





ideas of collaborative projects. Early on, it was decided to use shot cotton solids and a paper pieced 'interest'.

Ann brought a whole cloth piece from one of her quilt workshops that they all liked.

The group agreed on a beautiful piece of hand-dyed fabric to establish the color range. Then, each made prototype paper pieced squares and rectangles that

> reminded them of a colorful coaster that Jeanne Krener had brought back from a trip to Peru.





Houle did the embroidery around each paper pieced section. Allison Barrett did the 'no frame' binding around the quilt.

Challenge 2016 Announced

There are still twelve kits available. Kits will be available at the April meeting and future meetings until they are all taken. The cost is \$5.50 (exact change would be appreciated). One thing that we are offering this year is the fabric code information so if you want more of the given fabric you can find it locally or order it online. You will notice that everyone will receive the same light neutral fat quarter, but will have one of four dark neutral options in the fat eighth selection.



Theme: A Journey of Wonder - Real or Imagined

Definition: Journey

noun

- 1. an act or instance of traveling from one place to another
- 2. a day's travel
- 3. something suggesting travel or passage from one place to another; the journey from youth to maturity; a journey through time

verb

- 1. to go on a journey
- 2. to travel over or through

Synonyms: tour, passage, cruise, voyage, pilgrimage, jaunt, trip, outing, expedition, excursion, travel. From Merriam Webster

Size: 18" by 18" square or 18" by 24" rectangle (landscape or portrait)

Fabric: You must use the two fabrics on the front of the quilt along with any additional fabrics of your choice.

Due Date: August 1 at the MPQG meeting

<u>Construction:</u> Your quilt must have three layers - top, batting, and back. It can be hand or machine quilted, or tied. A sleeve for hanging at the 2016 Monterey County Fair and the 2017 MPQG Show is required.

Your quilts will be eligible for judging at the 2017 MPQG Show. There will be a Viewer's Choice ballot at the Monterey County Fair.

Block of the Month: April 2016 Instructions *Broken Dishes*

For this month we selected HST (Half Square Triangles) to make and arrange in the Broken Dishes layout. You need nicely contrasting fabrics (ORANGE or YELLOW plus a low volume/light fabric) to get the most of the block. Shouldn't this shape be called *Half Triangle Square* to really describe its shape? Well, Triangle Squares are all the rage as they have endless layout possibilities. Here are three different methods to make multiple half square triangles at once. You will need a total of 16 HSTs for this block, so why not try out all methods?

MATERIALS NEEDED:


Finished Square	Fabrics NEEDED: LOW VOLUME & ORANGE OR YELLOW	Method	Yields
2.0"	3.0" squares (1 of each color) x 2	Traditional	2 HST
2.0"	4 1/8" squares (1 of each color)	Alternative	4 HST
2.0"	6.0" squares (1 of each color)	Magic 8	8 HST



HOW TO:

Let's start with the Magic 8.

Cut your two fabrics to size indicated above and place right sides together. Mark your light colored fabric with diagonal lines corner to corner BOTH directions. Sew a 1/4" from the lines on both sides = 4 sew lines. Cutting: start with the horizontal cut, then vertical and then cut on both drawn lines which will give you 8 HSTs. Press seams and see Trimming to Size below.



Alternative Method. (Makes 4)

Again, cut your two fabrics to indicated square size, and place them right sides together. Now, sew around the outside a 1/4" from the edge. Cut on both diagonals to get four pieces. Be aware that you have bias edges when pressing these triangles open to squares and sewing them. See Trimming to Size below.



Traditional Method. (Makes 2)

Cut your two fabrics to the size indicated, place them right sides together, draw a line across ONE diagonal. Sew 1/4" from the drawn line on both sides (or if you have a special ruler, you can draw the sew lines.) Cut in half on the drawn line and press seams to darker fabric. See Trimming to Size below.



Use the 45 degree line on your ruler lining it up with your seam. Then line-up the 2.5" marks on both sides and trim to size.

Make 12 HSTs using Magic 8 and Alternative Method, and 4 HSTs using the Traditional Method twice. Layout per diagram with the light and dark fabric alternating as shown. Sew together in rows. Press seams on rows 1 and 3 to the right and 2 and 4 to the left. Sew rows together by nesting the seams. Press row seams open to reduce the bulk.

Your final block will measure 8.5". Admire! Questions: Send email to kbkreativ@gmail.com
