

## Color-Spumoni Workshop with Christine Barnes Sunday, August 4, 2019

We have just a few spots left for our August 4th, one-day workshop.

Do you stress when it's time to choose colors and fabrics for a new quilt? Do you wish you had a better "color sense"? As the Author of "The Quilters Color Club", Christine is the ideal teacher to help you put colors together. And Christine will teach her favorite workshop Color Spumoni - students love this class!



It was love at first sight, when Christine first saw this graphic block, often with the name of Japanese X and Plus block. What an opportunity for creative work with color! Each block is its own cohesive "color story" and could easily stand alone. Put nine different colored blocks together, and the bold (almost chaotic) pattern comes alive. The workshop begins with the concepts essential to making each block read—color, pattern, and value. Christine will do a demo on cutting and piecing the block, which is a cinch even for beginners. It's fast, and it's fun!

- On the "FAIR" page, in the far left column, scroll down and click on "Exhibits & Jr. Livestock Auction"
- On the "Exhibits & Jr. Livestock Auction" page, in the next-to-the-far-left-column, scroll down (past the orange, pink, and blue bars) just below "Enter Online" and click on the BLUE "Enter Online NONLIVESTOCK"
- You are finally at the "On-line Entries" page. Near the top of the page, click on the encircled 1 or "Register" and fill out requested information. Page 41 of the 2019 Entry Guide Book has the Rules and Regulations for guilts, the different Divisions and their descriptions, the classes and their descriptions.



## Block of the Month: July 2019 \* Patriotic Log Cabin Triangle\*



July brings Red, White & Blue to my mind. I was just introduced to this block through a Bee that I belong to. I resized the block to start with an easily available 5" squares. **These instructions will make two blocks.** Hope you will join the fun. <u>Block Source</u>.

#### **Materials Needed**

- (1) 5" square in Red or Blue;
- (2) 5" square in Light this can be white, or any fabric that "reads" light/ white aka "Low Volume"
- (3) 2.5" x 4.5" strips light/low volume
- (4) 2.5" x 6.5" strips light/low volume
- (2) 2.5" x 8.5" strips light/low volume

Note: All seams are scant 1/4" unless noted otherwise.

#### Instructions

- Make Half Square Triangles (HST) with the two 5" squares. Place light square on top of red/blue square right sides together. Draw line diagonal line on the back of the white square. Sew 1/4" from that line on both sides. Cut squares on the line to create two HSTs. Press seams to dark side. Trim HSTs to 4.5" squares.
- 2. Follow picture to build the log cabin to only the light side of the triangle:
- 3. Add 4.5" strip to the light side of the triangle. Press seam.
- 4. Add 6.5" strip to the other side. Press seam. Measure: Should be 6.5" square!
- 5. Add 6.5" strip to 4.5" strip. Press seam.
- 6. Add 8.5" strip to first 6.5" strip. Press seam.
- 7. Repeat steps 2-6 with the second HST or sew both blocks at once chain piecing.
- You will end up with two (2) blocks measuring 8.5" x
   8.5". Whether you started with a blue square or red square, both blocks will either have the red triangle or a blue triangle. Make more to see both color versions.
