Deborah is a full-time studio artist committed to the quilt medium. She is a professional member of the Studio Art Quilt Associates, and Art Quilt Network. Deborah's art focused on abstract, organic shapes while using surface treatments such as dyeing and painting fabric, photography and reclaimed materials. Deborah has been a professional educator for over 30 years. Besides teaching at-risk high school students in a public high school setting, Deborah has taught various art workshops such as the Quilt Surface Design Symposium, Quilting by the Lake and Art Quilt Tahoe, and Empty Spools Seminars.

QUILT SHOW ENTRIES! COME ONE, COME ALL!

Now that everyone has had an extra month (compared to past quilt shows) to complete a quilt (or two, or five) for the 42nd MPQG Quilt Show to be held in May, the deadline for submitting the Entry Forms and Judging application forms is fast coming up. Your Forms **MUST** be received by Colleen Johnson absolutely **NO LATER THAN MARCH 7** in order to have your quilts in the Quilt Show! Please do not not count on USPS to deliver your forms on time if you mail them in the week prior to March 7 – if something arrives on March 8 it can't be accepted, no matter what the postmark date might be.

If you wish to avoid mailing, you can drop your entries off to Colleen Johnson (831-999-0444) or Debbie Biller (831-595-2641) by calling ahead to make sure someone is home to receive your envelope, especially if you've included required Judging fees.

And **PLEASE** don't forget your 4x6" color glossy **PHOTO** of each and every quilt you enter – on the back please write the maker's name, the quilt's name, and the size of the quilt, then staple the photo to that quilt's entry form.

Scribes Needed – 2022 Quilt Show

The quilt show is coming soon! Looking for volunteers for the Judging day!

One of the important parts of the quilt show is having our quilts judged. If you haven't had quilts judged in the past, do consider doing so. It helps us to grow as quilters because the critiquing is a way to improve skills.

Volunteering as a scribe/judging helper gives an insight into honing techniques as we continue our quilting journey. You get to see what is important in piecing, quilting and binding skills.

If this is of interest, you may wish to be in the room to learn the aspects that the judge is looking for. Judging takes place the day before the show. It's a fun day of checking in the quilts, placing them in the correct categories, holding the quilts for the judge, running them into the main room for hanging as each category is finished and being able to take a quick peek at the show at the end of the day! If you wish to be a scribe, she tells you exactly what to put on the message to each quilter and it's the most important part of the judging process. This is a great job for someone who wants to volunteer but cannot stand for long periods of time.

So....consider this as a volunteer position this year! Just let me know if you would like to be added to the list for the day of judging.

Garage Sale at the Quilt Show

Garage Sale Guidelines

This is a DIY (do it yourself) project. The Garage Sale will accept all quilting and sewing related items, except books and magazines. Large items, like quilts and sewing machines, should be cleared with chairpersons. This is your chance to clean out your sewing area and help the guild earn some money in the process. Win-win!

THE BIG PICTURE

- 1. Open to all sewing related items IN GOOD CONDITION
- 2. NO ODORS IN FABRIC (fresh, not musty, or smelling of smoke)
- NO LOOSE FABRIC, ONLY FABRIC THAT IS:

 measured, rolled, taped (blue painter's tape) and marked
 fat quarters taped singly or in a stack
 quart sized zip-lock bags of scraps TAPED SHUT
- 4. Anything smaller than 1/4 yd. should go into a zip-lock scrap bag taped shut

MEASURING AND ROLLING

- 1. One fabric per roll.
- 2. Use a zip-lock bag if there are many pieces of the same fabric, taped shut
- 3. One piece folded selvage to selvage:
 - measure along selvage to the nearest complete increment of 1/4 yd.
 - If there is a lot left, fold it over to meet the rest and guess the total EXAMPLE: One piece measured along selvage could be described as: 2 ¹/₂ + (if it isn't quite 2 ³/₄)
- 4. Fabric that measures 2 yards or more may be folded instead of rolled. Please measure and roll around a bolt board. Use blue painters tape and wrap completely around securely. Mark length and pull out the board. These will go on a "flat fold" table.
- 5. Panel designs and similar pieces will be hung, so they can be turned in loose
- 6. Coordinating fabric pieces may be put into zip-lock bags and taped shut.

TURNING IN FABRIC

We appreciate your help to make the Garage Sale a clean and welcoming environment. DO NOT turn in any loose fabric, it will be thrown out. Honest. Turn in prepared fabric and other items at Chautauqua Hall in Pacific Grove, at 16th and Central on Wednesday, (load in day), or Thursday, (quilt turn-in) day the week of set up. Flying Geese Folly

Looking back over the challenges from past years, there has never been one that required a specific block in the quilt. We hope you will find this challenge "challenging" as well as inspiring and fun.

Each quilt must contain 3 Flying Geese blocks:

- They can be any size how many (or few) Flying Geese can you fit on your quilt?
- The geese can be flying around in a wedge, or can be a gaggle nesting in one corner.
- Use any technique you wish: appliqué, piecing . . .
- Feeling "artsy"? Incorporate the Flying Geese into a scene, flying over a building, trees, or a pond.
- Only the sky (and your imagination) are the limit.

Each quilt should measure 18" x 18" and contain 3 layers (top, batting and backing).

We hope you will participate in this year's challenge, it's so much fun to see how creative a group we are.

The quilts will be due in August. Hopefully, we will be able to meet in person so that we can see them up close and personal.



March BOM – # Greatblock



From a dark fabric, cut: $2 - 2.5^{\circ} \times 7.5^{\circ}$ strips $2 - 2.5^{\circ} \times 10.5^{\circ}$ strips

From a light fabric, cut:

3 – 2.5" x 7.5" strips 2 – 1.25" x 10.5" strips 2 – 1.25" x 12" strips



From the 2.5" x 7.5" strips, make a strip set, alternating colors. Press to the dark.

Cut the strip set across the stripes into 3 2.5" strips



Lay the newly created 2.5" strips out vertically on your work table, leaving space between the rows to lay the two dark 2.5" X 10.5" strips vertically in between. Assemble as shown.



Sew together and press to the solid.

Attach 1.25" x 10.5" strips to opposite sides of the block. Press. Attach 1.25" x 12" strips to the remaining sides of the block. Press.

Most MPQG Friendship Groups are meeting in person.



Definitions for Quilt Judging Categories

- **Traditional Quilts:** Based on a traditional design, pieced and/or appliquéd; includes English paper piecing and foundation piecing (on paper or fabric)
- **Top by One, Quilted by Another:** The quilt top has been completed by one person, and the quilting was done by someone else
- **Special Quilt Techniques:** Includes construction methods such as fusing and digital printing, surface design techniques and embellishments such as thread painting, beading, crystals, embroidery, and painting, or a mixture of hand and machine quilting; includes tied quilts, as well as any quilt that does not obviously fit into any other category
- Group Quilt: A quilt with a top which has been completed by two or more persons
- **Kit Quilt:** A quilt made by using, and perhaps altering somewhat, a kit which includes the pattern and pre-selected fabric, thereby collaborating with the author of the pattern and the maker of the kit. **The quilt shall otherwise be entirely completed by the maker, including the quilting.** *A kit quilt will not be eligible for Best of Show.*
- **Modern Quilts:** Usually functional, simplistic and minimalist, often with bold colors and prints, high contrast, asymmetric design, improvisational piecing, expansive negative space and alternate grid work
- Art Quilts: Completely original design meant to be hung as a work of art
- **PLEASE NOTE:** A quilt might seem to fit in several categories, but please choose the category you believe best fits your quilt. The Preview Committee will also be assessing the photo for appropriate category and may call you concerning the chosen category if a question arises.
